1.3 Establishment Details:

Vasantrao Naik Government Institute of Arts and Social Sciences (VNGIASS), in Nagpur, India, established in 1885 as Morris College, is one of the oldest colleges in the country. It takes its name from the former Chief Minister of Maharashtra, the late Vasantrao Naik, who was an alumnus of the college. VNGIASS is permanently affiliated to Rashtrasant Tukadoji Maharaj Nagpur University since 1990 . Although Nagpur was capital of Central Provinces, there was no college there in 1882, when, under the leadership of Sir Bipin Krishna Bose, Mukund Balkrishna Buti, Madhavrao Gangadhar Chitanavis and others, the Committee of the Neill City High School of Nagpur took the initiative, and collected the sum of Rs 19,000 and started a college at Nagpur in memory of Sir John Morris. Later they formed The Nagpur Morris College Association, and they approached the Chief Commissioner of the Central Provinces to established a college, which was eventually established in June 1885. Vasantrao Naik Government Institute of Arts and Social Sciences was affiliated to Calcutta University until 1904, and later to Allahabad University. In 1923 it was one of six colleges affiliated to Nagpur University.

After hundred years of existence, the college was renamed as Vasantrao Naik Government Institute of Arts and Social Sciences, by then Chief Minister Sudhakarrrao Naik, in 1985. This was in honour of Shri Vasantrao Naik, his uncle, who served the longest tenure as the Chief Minister of Maharashtra and illustrious alumni of our Institution. The college has grown steadily over the years, from only 21 students in 1885 to 1919 students at present.

Library: The Institute has a separate & individual building for its Library, divided in three parts. The Library supports and extends the academic aspects of the Institution. It helps in meeting the teaching needs of the students and faculty. It not only provides study facilities; it also provides Educational, Reprography, Computer, Wi-Fi Campus INTERNET, **N-LIST-INFLIBNET** (National Library and Information Services Infrastructure for Scholarly Content) **E-Resources** (e-Journals and e-Books) and recreational reading to all the members of the Institution. The Institution endeavors to make the Library user friendly. It is equipped with 88429+ books (i.e. references, text, literature, autobiographies, biographies, encyclopedias, dictionaries, rare books, old books, bound vols. of journals, bulletin, reports etc.) and subscribed to Online **E-resources** and different (Regional, National & International) print research journals/periodicals, magazines, competitive magazines (including gratis) and 13 newspapers in three languages.

The library is also providing open access services to all students of post graduate courses (i.e. Urdu, Persian, Arabic, Sanskrit, Marathi, English, Geography, History, Pol. Science, Philosophy, Music, Economics and Home Economics), staff members, research scholars, (Ph.D., M.Phil. MRP, JRF/SRF,) researchers, writers, philosophers and other readers. Total thirteen subjects offer post graduate in the Institution.

We extend our **Library services** (INFLIBNET N-LIST E-Resources (e-Journals & e-Books) Wi-Fi INTERNET, OPAC, CAS, SDI, Reprography and other library services) to research scholars, ex-students and other readers.

For FY 2023-24, Institute will submit the budget to the Government in the month of June- July.

Institute has formed IDP Committee (vide Office order No. 2019 dated 6/12/2022) wherein Nodal Officers and Asst. Nodal Officers are appointed to look after the vision and goals of the college in a time bound manner. The Institute IDP Committee has framed the immediate and long term goals in consultation with various stakeholders. Keeping in mind the provisions of NEP, after the 4th NAAC Cycle, the Institute will apply for empowered Autonomy.

Institute is strictly following the baseline data while filling AQAR, AISHE, DHE-MIS and Students –on-Rolls. All these compliances are timely followed with the strict essence of baseline data and the same are attached herewith in the annexure.

Salient features of Vasantrao Naik Government Institute of Arts and Social Sciences, Nagpur
